

Municipal Support

Through PennDOT Connects, the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation and its regional planning partners are strengthening their partnerships with communities by involving local government at the very beginning of the planning process so that land use, development, and transportation are better integrated and more effective.

The PennDOT Connects policy changed the project development process to enhance transportation planning. It requires communities to have meaningful opportunities for engagement in the initial stages of the planning process with PennDOT and the regional planning partners.

A more strategic approach to engagement ensures local priorities and issues are effectively considered as transportation needs and investments are planned and developed. The result is improved decision making, better investments, and greater local impacts.

Through PennDOT Connects, resources are being provided to support municipalities to better understand:

- the integration of transportation and land use planning in transportation project development;
- the integration of transportation and land use in comprehensive plans and/or corridor plans; and
- the implementation tools available to improve the transportation and land use connection.
