PennDOT to Hold a Second Plans Display for Possible Improvements at the Intersection of Routes 6N and 99 in Edinboro, Erie County

Oil City, PA – The Pennsylvania Department of Transportation (PennDOT) invites the public to view the updated proposed improvements to the intersection of Route 6N (Route 3006) and Route 99 (Erie Street) in the Borough of Edinboro, Erie County.

PennDOT has revised the preliminary alternatives that were previously presented at an open house held in January.

The plans display will be held from 5 to 6 PM, May 1. The purpose of the meeting is to update the public on the revised options for improvements of the intersection. Among the information that will be available is the likely impacts of each alternative, estimated project costs and timelines, as well as a discussion on the purpose and need of the project. PennDOT representatives will give a formal presentation at 6 PM.

Representatives from PennDOT and the consultant will be on hand to gather feedback, which will be used to help refine the potential improvements and identify a project implementation strategy.

The plans display is also an opportunity for the public to review and comment on the project's potential effect upon Cultural Resources pursuant to the Advisory Council on Historic Preservation's 36 CFR Part 800 regulations implementing Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act.

The display is being held in a facility that complies with requirements of the Americans with Disabilities Act, and it is accessible to individuals who have disabilities. Also, the project documents will be made available in alternative languages or formats if requested.
