PennDOT Announces Public Meeting for Study of Route 58 Corridor in Mercer County

Oil City, PA – The Pennsylvania Department of Transportation (PennDOT) invites the public to a public meeting and plans display on the Route 58 Corridor Safety Study in Mercer County.

An open house plans display will be held from 6 to 8 PM, April 24. The goal of the meeting is to introduce the public to the study and gather input to help in the development of a long-range strategy for improving the corridor, which focuses on Route 58 (Greenville-Mercer Road) in Mercer County from Main Street in the Borough of Greenville to North Street in the Borough of Mercer.

The purpose of the study is to identify existing issues related to Route 58, including safety, traffic operations, corridor deficiencies, roadway and bridge conditions, support of planning initiatives, and support of the regional economy.

Information on the study's purpose, status, schedule, and an initial range of ideas to consider will be available for review and comment. PennDOT representatives, along with the design consultants, will make a brief presentation at 6:15 PM and will be available to answer questions.
