Atherton Street Project Update for Late December

State College, PA – The Pennsylvania Department of Transportation (PennDOT) is issuing a late **December** update for its North Atherton Street (Route 3014) project in State College. No work is anticipated for the remainder of 2019.

The contractor may perform signal work after the New Year’s holiday, with project completion set for spring of 2020. Overall work has included relocation of numerous utility lines, relocation of sewer and water lines, drainage improvements, curbing, sidewalks, ADA ramps, traffic signal upgrades, new concrete median, and paving.

Motorists **can expect** the following **December 23 through January 3**:

- ❖ **West Aaron Drive to Curtin Road—entire length of project:**
 - ❖ **No work anticipated for the next two weeks.**
 - ❖ **In 2020, work will take place between Park Avenue and Curtin Road. That work includes installation of PSU casings for future development, installation of drainage, curb, sidewalk, and curb ramps, signal upgrades, and paving of the remaining area. Work is expected to take place May through June.**
- ❖ **Park Avenue through Curtin Road:**
 - ❖ **The contractor may perform signal work after the New Year’s holiday. Traffic will be reduced to a single lane in each direction while work is being performed. Travel delays are possible.**

All work is weather and schedule dependent. Glenn O. Hawbaker, Inc. of State College is the contractor on this \$12.8 million job. **Drivers are reminded to move through work zones with caution, obey posted speed limits, and always buckle up.**
