PennDOT Clinton County Maintenance work schedule for the week of November 7 to November 10

Mill Hall, PA – The Pennsylvania Department of Transportation Clinton County Maintenance announces the following work schedule for the week of November 7 to November 10, weather permitting. Motorists should travel with extra caution in these and all work areas. Motorists should be aware that due to the nature of highway maintenance and emergency work, crews could be working on any highway at any time of the day or night.

The following work is scheduled to be completed by contractor, weather permitting.

SR0220

- Work will continue next week to replace bridge bearings on the SR2015 bridge over SR220 for the NB onramp at the Mill Hall interchange. Traffic will continue to be rerouted on SR2015 for both directions of traffic to cross over SR220 on the SR220 NB

offramp bridge. Traffic will also be reduced to a single lane on SR220 in both directions throughout the week using daylight setups. Pending concrete breaks, the Contractor will be removing the traffic patterns on SR2015 this Friday, November 4th after performing line painting. Work remaining at this structure will include electrical work for the overhead sign structure attached to the bridge, guide rail installation and minor misc. work that will be performed with temporary lane closures regulated with flaggers throughout the daylight hours as necessary. A 10' width restriction is to remain in place until November 11, 2016. The work is anticipated to be completed late November 2016

SR0220 Bridges over SR0120 (Paul Mack Blvd.)

- The Contractor will continue to work on the bridges for SR 220 spanning SR 120 (Paul Mack Blvd.) to install new bearings and to repair and encapsulate the pier caps. Traffic control will consist of shoulder closures on SR 120 during the daylight hours. Work is anticipated to be completed by the end of December.

SR120 – near the village of Shintown in Noyes Township

- Traffic will be restricted to one lane and controlled by temporary signals 24 hours a day, while work is being performed on the fill side of the roadway. Temporary barrier will be in place to protect motorist while the contractor installs concrete curb and new guiderail along the southern side of the roadway. The contractor will continue installing Soil Nails in order to reinforce the soil slope on the southern side of the roadway. Motorists are advised to watch for slow moving and stopped vehicles through the entire work zone and to obey the posted speed limit.

SR4005 (First Bridge Past Pump Station)

SR4005 (Fourth Bridge Past Pump Station)

SR44

- No work anticipated

SR44 over SR 220

- The contractor will continue rehabilitation work on the piers and abutments. The travel (right) lanes on SR220 in both the northbound and southbound directions will remain closed. The SR44 bridge directly over SR220 will remain closed in order to install new expansion dams and place a new latex concrete deck. Traffic needing to cross this bridge to access SR 44 to the north or Avis to the south is being directed along the detour route. Traffic needing to cross the bridge in the northern direction is being directed to travel north on SR220 to the Thomas Street exit. Traffic is then being routed back on SR220 south to the Pine Creek exit where they are able to travel north on SR44. Traffic wanting to cross the bridge in the southern direction is being directed to travel SR220 south to the Avis interchange. Traffic is then being routed back on SR220 north to the Pine Creek exit where they are able to turn right toward Avis. The detour is expected to be in place until mid-November. The Contractor will tentatively open the bridge on Friday, November 11 pending scheduling subcontractors and weather next week.

SR64

- Roadway Paving
- Traffic signals with a 12' Width restriction.

SR2006

- The Contractor will continue to perform concrete repairs to the SR220 Bridge pier next to the roadway. Traffic will be restricted to a single lane using flaggers. The work is anticipated to take place throughout the month of November.
