

Stop The Bleed Training

PennDOT District 12

Problem

A person can bleed to death in less than five minutes, which makes it difficult for emergency medical responders to arrive fast enough to control bleeding and save lives.

Our employees are very often on the scene before emergency medical responders. With the goal of saving lives, the Stop The Bleed training aims to educate employees on how to control bleeding.

Challenge

Considering the number of employees in District 12 (784), scheduling outside instructors for multiple classes would be a challenge. The solution was to certify in-house instructors to conduct the training.



Results

To date, over 175 employees have received the Stop The Bleed training. Our county maintenance offices have purchased tourniquets and bleed kits. We currently have four in-house instructors.







Process

- **First**: Contact a local instructor. This can be at your local EMS, or local hospital. \bullet
- **Second**: Schedule a class and arrange for this to also be a Train-the-Trainer class. Employees already trained to instruct First Aid/CPR classes are excellent candidates to instruct this class.
- **Third**: Inquire what local agency currently has training equipment available for \bullet loan to conduct training. Your local instructor should be able to direct you to a source.
