There's Nothing Hollow About This Award

Pittsburgh's Fern Hollow Bridge collapsed in January 2022, severing an important connection between Pittsburgh neighborhoods and the adjacent Edgewood and Wilkinsburg communities, and disrupting public transit, emergency and school travel. PennDOT, the City of Pittsburgh and FHWA, along with a variety of contractors and consultants, utilized emergency procedures to expedite the design and construction processes to open the bridge to traffic in just 11 months.

These efforts resulted in the Fern Hollow Bridge project receiving a regional America's Transportation Award from the American Association of State Highway and Transportation Officials (AASHTO). As a result, the project is now among the Top 12 finalists to compete for the Grand Prize and the People's Choice Award. The Grand Prize recipient will be selected by an independent panel of judges, while the People's Choice Award will be given to the project that garners the highest number of online votes from the general public, weighted by state population.

Now in its seventh year, this year's PennDOT's Innovations Challenge asks high school students to develop a plan for the replacement of an aging multi-lane roadway that will reconnect previously separated neighborhoods. PennDOT has again partnered with the Associated Pennsylvania Constructors (APC) and the American Council of Engineering Companies of Pennsylvania (ACEC/PA) organizations that will provide a combined total award of \$4,000 to the statewide winning team.
