

# MILLBROOK ROAD BRIDGE PRESERVATION PROJECT, MERCER CO.

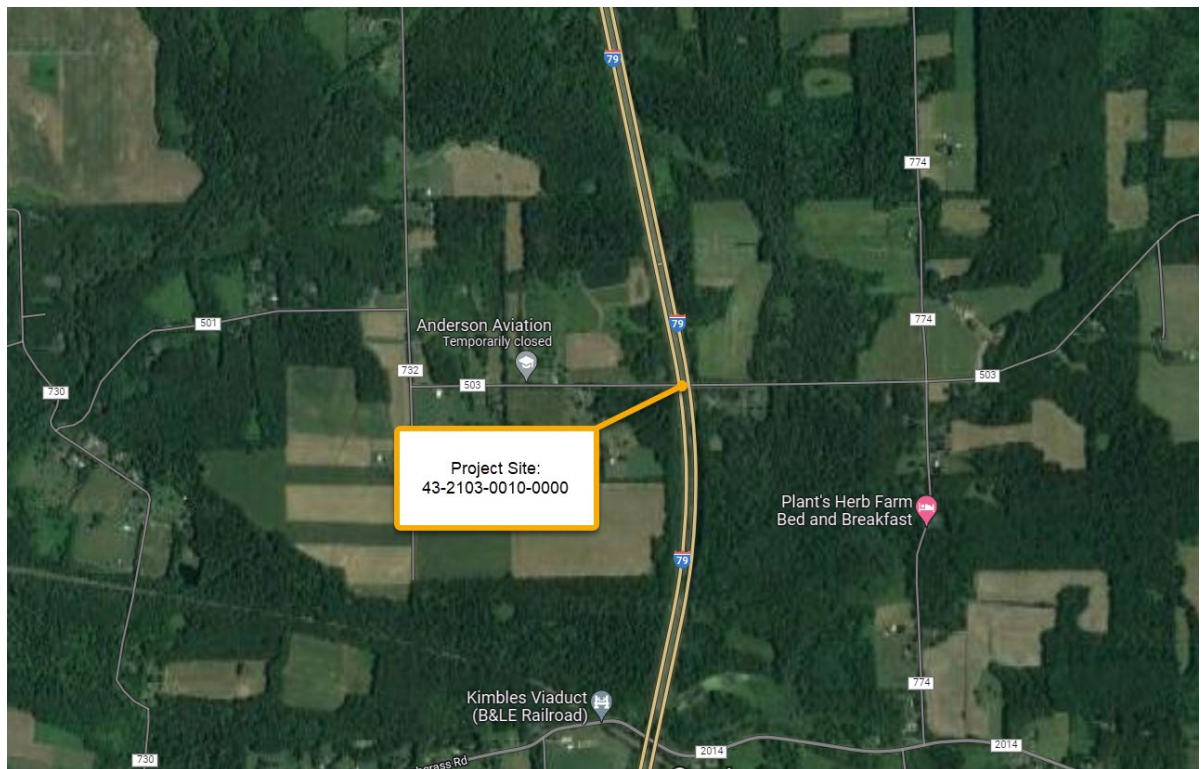
## PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The proposed scope of work includes preservation work to the structure carries Millbrook Road (Route 2103) over Interstate 79 in Jackson Township.

The existing structure was built in 1965. Approximately 100 vehicles a day use the bridge, on average.

## PROJECT AREA

The bridge is located on Millbrook Road (Route 2103), approximately 1/2 mile west from the intersection of township road 774, South Foster Road.



## PROPOSED PLAN

Work will involve concrete deck repairs, replace roller bearings at pier 3, removing all bridge deck joints, concrete repairs to substructure and minor barrier modifications. No major change in roadway grade anticipated which will include shoulder back up. The existing pavement will be milled and overlaid to tie into proposed structure.

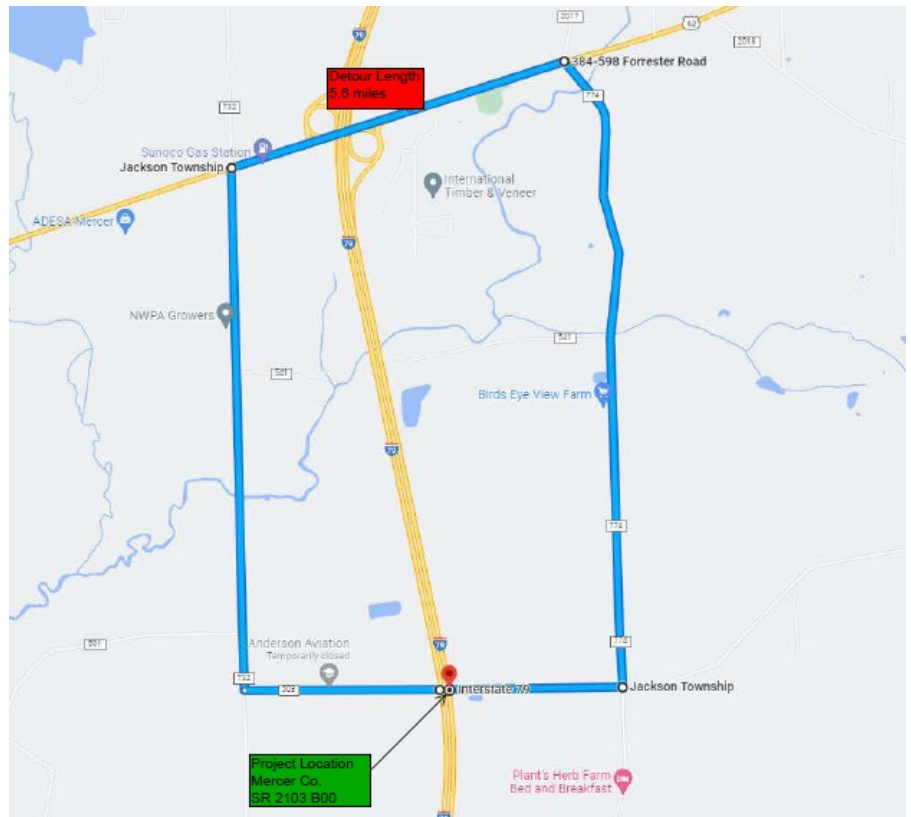
## ANTICIPATED CONSTRUCTION TIMELINE

Work is expected to occur during the 2024 construction season.

## TRAFFIC IMPACTS

A detour will be required for construction and is expected to be in place for approximately two to three months.

The proposed 5.8-mile detour route will be posted using South Cottage Road, Route 62, and South Foster Road.



## CONSTRUCTION FUNDING

The estimated construction cost is \$800,000. This project is funded at least in part by the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law (BIL).

## CURRENT PUBLIC COMMENT PERIOD

The purpose of the public comment period is to introduce the project and receive input regarding any questions or concerns with the project. It is also an opportunity for the public to review and comment on the project's potential effect upon Cultural Resources pursuant to the Advisory Council on Historic Preservation's 36 CFR Part 800 regulations implementing Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act. The project documents can be made available in alternative languages or formats if requested.
