

Cuts, Scrapes, and Puncture Wounds

- For a puncture wound, leave the object in place 1.
- Stop the bleeding
- Clean the wound
- Apply an antibiotic (Neosporin)
- 2. 3. 4. 5. 6. Cover the wound
- Change dressing regularly
- Watch for signs of infection 7.

Major:

Cut is deep

- 1. Follow instructions above
- 2. Seek medical attention immediately

Skin is severely torn and bleeding

- Have the injured person lie down 1.
- While wearing medical gloves, remove any obvious dirt from the wound. Do not 2. attempt to remove large or deeply embedded objects.
- With a sterile bandage, apply pressure directly on the wound until bleeding stops. If bleeding soaks through the bandage, do not remove, add more. 3.

- 5. Seek medical attention immediately.

Seek medical attention if:

- Wound is deep
- Bleeding persists
- Wound becomes infected
- Puncture wound in foot •
- Wound is result of animal/human bite •
- Puncture wound is contaminated
